# June Meeting Minutes

The Crawford County Historical & Genealogical Society met on June 12, 2006 in the Media Center at the Crawford County Jr.-Sr. High School, with President Jim Kaiser presiding. The May minutes were read, and after some corrections were made the minutes were approved.

Richard Eastridge introduced Sandi Feaster who will be working on the historical survey in Crawford County. Sandi gave a brief description of what she will be doing, such as taking pictures and getting information on man-made structures 40 years of age and older. Laura Renwick set a date of July 19, 2006 to have a kick-off meeting to let the public know about the survey that Sandi is conducting. The meeting will be held at the Crawford County Public Library in English at 7 P.M.

The financial report was given by Sharon Morris with an ending balance of \$4,558.95 on June 12, 2006.

Bills were presented by the following people: Larry & Helena Burmeister \$21.72 for supplies bought for the open house at the Proctor House; Priscilla Eastridge \$28.18 for postage and \$1,622.92 for publications that were printed; Becky Stetter \$32.50 for printing; and David Vanlaningham \$130.00 for the web site.

Sandra Wilson gave the report for the Audit Committee and Priscilla Eastridge gave the Income and Expense Budget for the year.

Larry Burmeister gave the archives report. The total receipts were \$110.80, total deposits \$214.44, and \$11.70 cash on hand. There were 17 visitors to the archives.

The Proctor House report was given by Evelyn and Hugh Jackson. Evelyn contacted Duke Energy who sent someone out to look at the tree. They will trim the limbs that are over the power lines, but will not take down the whole tree. A scrapbook of improvements made to the kitchen and bathroom was passed around for everyone to see.

Mary Wiseman can use as much help as possible in sorting and pricing the items for the yard sale. It was discussed having officers of the Society and the Proctor House Committee ride in two golf carts for the 4th of July parade. Harry Wood is going to be the Grand Marshall. Two people from community service were sent to the house to weed-eat, pick up rocks, and do other odd jobs in the yard.

On fund raising, Becky Stetter gave the report she made to Bonita Coots about the success of the activity books. Sandy Wilson has collected \$132.20 from ornament sales and has orders for another \$294.68. Becky reported the unattended table with the ornaments at the English Alumni Banquet was not a good idea as someone took one of the ornaments! Becky also stopped at Jasper to check the price of a banner of the society logo. A 2x3 banner was approximately \$50.00, so she will check some other places.

Richard Eastridge read a letter concerning a memorial that is being made to honor law officials who were killed in the line of duty. Information is being sought for John O. Snyder.

Richard also gave the publications report. There are four different books (26 of each) that are ready to be picked up at the printers.

David Vanlaningham suggested that a meeting with the web committee be held to discuss having a Q&A forum put on the web site. Evelyn Jackson asked that the ornaments that are for sale be put on the site as well. It was also discussed having a phone line put in the old court house.

The Vice President's report was given by Densil Wilson. Heritage Day at Patoka Lake was held May 20, no sales were made that day. Old Eckerty Days is still being planned, it will be held September 23.

In new business, Hugh Jackson brought up purchasing an external hard drive to store digital information for the society. The motion carried and Becky Stetter is to make the purchase.

Roberta Toby gave an update on her work with the CCC Camp.

Becky Stetter turned in an article to the Clarion about the Memorial day service that was held at the Proctor House.

Officers were elected and appointments made for the 2006-2007 year.

The next meeting will be held on July 10 at the Union Chapel Church, founded in 1900. Anyone wishing to car pool may meet at the Proctor House.
